Kenneth S. Ramos, MD, PhD, PharmB

Kenneth Ramos, MD, PhD, PharmB is Professor of Medicine in the Division of Pulmonary, Allergy, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine and Associate Vice President of Precision Health Sciences at the University of Arizona Health Sciences Center. He also serves as Director of the Center for Applied Genetics and Genomic Medicine. Dr. Ramos leads the development of precision-health strategies and approaches to improve health outcomes and health-care delivery in Arizona and provides senior leadership in the area of personal diagnostics and therapeutics for complex diseases, including cancer, cardiopulmonary disorders and diabetes.

Dr. Ramos' research program integrates diverse approaches ranging from molecular genetics to population-based public health studies to understand the genomic bases of human disease and to advance the goals of precision medicine. He has mentored over 100 students, many of whom have gone on to successful careers in academia, medicine, government and industry.

Dr. Ramos completed a B.S. in Pharmaceutical Sciences and Chemistry (Magna Cum Laude) at the University of Puerto Rico, a Ph.D. in Biochemical Pharmacology at the University of Texas at Austin and an M.D. degree with postgraduate training in Internal Medicine at the University of Louisville Health Sciences Center. He has previously held faculty positions at the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Texas A&M University and the University of Louisville School of Medicine.

Dr. Ramos is past president of the American Heart Association Texas Affiliate and Society of Toxicology. He is recipient of the Society of Toxicology Achievement Award, AstraZeneca Traveling Lectureship Award and Distinguished Service Award from the American Heart Association. He is Associate of the National Academy of Sciences, Diplomate of the American College of Forensic Examiners and Fellow of the Academy of Toxicological Sciences.



Brigadier General Dr A Halim Hj Basari

Brigadier General Dr A Halim Hj Basari graduated as a pharmacist from the College of Pharmacy, Medical University of South Carolina (USA) with a BS Pharmacy in 1989. After passing his RPh licenses in the States of South Carolina and Kansas, he started his career with the Department of Pharmacy at the University of Kansas Medical Centre in 1989. While working he pursued his graduate education and obtained his MS Hospital Pharmacy from the School of Pharmacy, University of Kansas (USA) in 1992. At the same time he also completed a two year ASHP Accredited Residency in Hospital Pharmacy in 1991.

He then came home and was commissioned into the Malaysian Armed Forces (MAF) as an Army Lieutenant in the Royal Medical and Dental Corps in 1992. As he is the pioneer in being the first military pharmacist in the country, he was tasked to devise a strategic plan that will establish, develop and expand the profession of military pharmacy for the nation.

While in the service, he obtained his Graduate Diploma in Logistics Science (Distinction) from the Anglia Polytechnic University, United Kingdom in 2000. Later he was awarded a PhD (Healthcare Supply Chain Management) from the Australian Institute of Business (AIB) in 2009 and became a Research Fellow since then.

Brigadier General Dr A Halim is currently the Director of Pharmacy at the Health Services Division of the MAF Headquaters and is in charge of the overall leadership and management of the military pharmaceutical care and pharmamedlog services within the MAF and the Ministry of Defence.



Surakit Nathisuwan

Surakit Nathisuwan received a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy from the Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University in 1994 and a Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of Florida in 1999. He later completed a Pharmacy Practice Residency at the Florida Hospital in Orlando and then Specialized Residency in Pharmacotherapy from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio and became a Board Certified Pharmacotherapy Specialist in 2001. He is currently working as a faculty member at the Department of Pharmacy, Faculty of Pharmacy, Mahidol University, Thailand. His main area of teaching and research interest is cardiovascular pharmacotherapy. For pharmacy education, he has played an instrumental role in the establishment of a Doctor of Pharmacy program and postdoctoral training (residency and fellowship) both at the university level and the national level. He has also been working collaboratively with professional organizations to advance competency of Thai pharmacists toward patient-oriented care.

He is nationally known for leading the establishment of pharmacy services in cardiology area especially anticoagulation clinic. He has been invited to serve in various capacities both within and outside of pharmacy realm to promote integration of pharmacy service into Thailand's health system. Examples of those positions are Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the Association of Hospital Pharmacists, Secretariat of the College of Pharmacotherapeutics of Thailand under the

Pharmacy Council of Thailand, Committee Member of Cardiovascular Drugs Working Group of the National Essential Drug List Committee, Ministry of Public Health (MOPH), Member of the Advisory Board of the Health Product Vigilance Center, MOPH, Writing Committee for the National Clinical Practice Guideline on Diabetes Management. For administrative positions, he had served as Assistant Dean for Academic Affairs (2006-2008), Deputy Dean for International Relations (2008-11) and Vice President for International Relations, Mahidol University (2011-2014).



Asrul Akmal Shafie BPharm, PhD

Asrul A Shafie is a registered pharmacist in Malaysia since 2001 and completed his PhD degree in pharmacoeconomic in Cardiff University, UK in 2007. His research interests are in the application of economic evaluation in pharmaceutical services and product, and pharmacy practice. He is now leading and co-investigating several researches in pharmacy practice, PRO instrument validation and valuation, and health technology assessment where he has published more than 200 peer reviewed journal articles/abstracts in various international journals including Value in Health, Social Science & Medicine, Quality of Life Research, BMC Public Health and Pharmacoeconomics, six books/monographs and a chapter in the Springer's Encyclopaedia of Quality of Life and Well-Being Research. He regularly reviewed manuscripts for international and local publications including British Medical Journal, Bulletin WHO and Value in Health. He was invited to speak in more than fifty international and domestic scientific events in UK, US, South Korea, Indonesia, Japan, China, Thailand and Singapore.

He is an appointed expert member for the UK National Institute for Health Research Committee, Malaysia Health Technology Assessment Agency (MaHTAS), Malaysia Pharmacoeconomic Guidelines Development Committee, Malaysia National Medicine Policy Steering Committee, Ministry of Health's Quality Use of Medicine Committee, Malaysia Health

Promotion Board, Institute of Health Service Research, Malaysia Pharmacy Advisory Board and Malaysia Pharmacoeconomic Technical Committee. He plays an active and vital role in professional societies and previously served as the Chair-Elect for ISPOR Good Outcomes Research Practices & Publications Committee, Co-editor for ISPOR News Across Asia, Chairman for Malaysian Pharmaceutical Society (Penang Branch) and current Board Member for HTAsiaLink Network. In 2010, he was awarded the prestigious International Fellowship for International Society of Pharmacoeconomics and Outcomes Research. At present, Dr Asrul is an Associate Professor and Chairman in social and administrative pharmacy in Universiti Sains Malaysia, where he teaches pharmacoeconomic, statistic and epidemiology to both undergraduates and postgraduates in the university and four other local institutions.

- Abstract should be in English and will be published in the Malaysian Journal of Pharmacy.
- Abstract should only include the body of the abstract, with the introduction, objectives, method, results, discussion and conclusion (in a single paragraph without any headings) in no more than 250 words. Figures, tables, schemes, structural formulae, illustrations and/or graphs of any size are not allowed.

Each presenter is allowed to submit a total of 3 papers for oral presentation.
